Fact Sheet

- Safe Harbor is the only Global Foundation of Animal Sanctuaries Accredited horse rescue in the state of Tennessee.
- Since our founding in 2013, we have rescued, rehabilitated, and rehomed more than 550 equine and livestock animals.
- We are a foster-farm based organization with about two dozen active fosters throughout middle Tennessee and southern Kentucky. Our rescue does not own real estate.
- We are 100% volunteer run – no one on our team earns a salary, which means that all donations benefit the animals in our care.
- Safe Harbor’s sanctuary program provides lifetime care for animals that are considered “unadoptable” due to age, temperament or behavior.
- Safe Harbor’s After the Track program was developed as an alternative for racehorse owners and trainers to rehome their retiring racehorses rather than send them to auction. Our program guarantees a lifetime safety net.
- Safe Harbor’s community outreach mission includes horse camp for children and adults, girl scout badge days, retreats for women’s shelters and foster children, and more.

Some costs associated with intake and care of one horse:

Initial vetting upon arrival: \$250

Hay and feed per month: \$150

Hoof care/farrier: \$40-\$60 every 6 weeks

Supplemental care (chiropractic, vitamins, etc.): \$100 or more per month

Training: \$700 per month
